

BECOMING A POLICE RESERVIST

A Reservist is an auxiliary member recruited to serve as reinforcement to the Namibian Police Force in the fulfillment of the duties and activities in terms of Section 13 of the Police Act, Act 19 of 1990.

RESERVISTS are not permanent employee's per-se, but rather voluntary workers who are required to perform Police duties, for not more than 10 hours an month.

HOW TO BECOME A POLICE RESERVIST

RESERVISTSARE REQUIRED TO DO VOLUNTARY WORK AND CAN ONLY BE COMPENSATED IF:

- Called up for Police Basic Training
- Recruited as Police Officers
- Injured while executing Police duties
- Loss of income due to injuries sustained while performing Police duties

IMPORTANT

You must be fulltime gainfully employed with no criminal records and should be mentally and physical fit. Applications should go to their nearest Police Stations to complete and submit their application forms. You should be able to volunteer at least three hours of your free time a week.

On appointment one will be issued with an appointment certificate sighed by the Inspector General of Police.

Successfully appointed Reservist should note that this is not a fulltime job offer and that they should avoid wrong impression that they will ultimately be permanent employed.

An excellent performance reference as a Police Reservist may lead to favorable consideration for fulltime employments in the Police Force, provided they meet basic requirements for recruitment in the Namibian Police Force and there are vacancies available.

- REQUIREMENTS TO BE MET TOO BECOME A POLICE RESERVIST
- Be a Namibian citizen
- Good character
- Between 21 and 50 years old
- No criminal record
- Mentally and physically fit

- Literate (able to read, speak & write English)
- Employed elsewhere

Being employed is one of the criteria:

However these employed in the following institutions cannot be appointed as Police Reservists:

- Security and Law enforcer
- NDF, City Police
- Security Officers
- Law Institutes
- Members of the Media
